AmeriCorps National Civilian Community Corps (NCCC) is a federal, national service program for 18-26 year-olds from diverse backgrounds, that strengthens communities and develops leaders through team-based national and community service. The Pacific Region assigns teams to service projects across 9 states and territories, helping communities address their most critical needs while developing our members personally and professionally.

Who Can Receive a Team?

Nonprofit and faith-based organizations, government entities (federal, state and local), public schools and universities, and Tribal and Native Nations.



What Can Our Teams Do?

NCCC teams work on a variety of projects, each lasting up to the length of the round. Service areas include:

- Disaster Mitigation, Response & Recovery
- Urban and Rural Development
- Environmental Stewardship
- Energy Conservation
- Infrastructure Improvement

How Does an Organization Receive a Team?

First, a Project Concept Form must be submitted to the Assistant Program Director (APD) for your state. Once the Project Concept Form is approved, you will be invited to submit a full application. Sponsors are awarded a team based on the number of applications per round and regional priorities.

AmeriCorps

NCCC Provides

- A team of about 8-10 members from diverse social, cultural, and educational backgrounds
- Team Leader to coordinate team (Team Leader is not a technical skills supervisor)
- Van and fuel for team transportation (except AK & HI)
- Team is allotted a food budget and prepares their own meals
- Basic PPE (including hard hats, gloves, masks, & boots)
- Members are covered by Federal Tort Claims Act & Federal Employees' Compensation Act
- All members are screened with a fingerprinted FBI national criminal history check



Sponsoring Organizations Must Provide:

- Lodging for the team, to include a full kitchen and bathroom with showers; cleaning supplies and toilet paper
- All project materials, tools and related protective gear
- Any work permits required to complete project work
- Daily technical supervision for team, on-the-job training and relevant certifications
- Orientation to the organization and community
- Service Learning education on the community needs and deeper issues pertaining to the project
- At least **40 hours a week per member** of enriching service that meets the needs outlined in the application
